# 110 sekolah diarah tutup

Arahan penutupan dilakukan berikutan terdapat kes jangkitan Covid-19 di sekolah terlibat

**SHAH ALAM**

**B**eberapa sekolah di tiga negeri diarahkan tutup susulan terdapat kes jangkitan Covid-19 dikesan berlaku.

Di **SELANGOR**, Jabatan Pendidikan Negeri (JPN) Selangor menerusi kenyataan pada Ahad memaklumkan sebanyak 79 sekolah diarahkan tutup selama dua hari bermula Isnin.

"Sekolah terlibat meliputi 19 di daerah Hulu Langat, 18 di Petaling Perdana dan 15 di Klang.

"Sebanyak 27 sekolah ma-

sing-masing dari daerah Petaling Utama, Sepang, Gombak, Hulu Selangor dan Kuala Langat turut diarahkan tutup," menurut kenyataan itu.

Dalam pada itu, Menteri Besar Selangor, Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari memaklumkan, keputusan penutupan sekolah di Selangor adalah di bawah bidang kuasa JPN dan hasil perbincangan antara Pusat Kesihatan Daerah (PKD) dan Jabatan Kesihatan Negeri.

"Berbanding 19 buah sekolah yang ditutup sebelum ini, ia tidak mengikut saluran dan juga perbincangan yang sewajarnya walaupun kita terima.

"Maka, kali ini kita ikut format tersebut iaitu setelah PKD memaklumkan dan Jabatan Kesihatan Negeri menyatakan sekolah itu wajar ditutup, jadi kita akan tutup kerana pengawal untuk semua sekolah di Selangor terletak di bawah Jabatan Pendidikan Selangor," katanya.



SMK Seremban 2 diarah tutup oleh Pejabat Pendidikan Daerah (PPD) pada Jumaat lalu berikutan 17 individu yang telah disahkan positif Covid-19.

Sementara itu, di **PULAU PINANG**, sebanyak 20 buah sekolah ditutup dua hari bermula Isnin susulan terdapat kes Covid-19 dalam kalangan warga sekolah.

Pengarah Jabatan Pendidikan Pulau Pinang, Abdul Rashid Abdul Samad berkata, penutupan itu membolehkan sekolah menengah dan rendah.

"Penutupan itu bagi membolehkan proses sanitasi dilakukan di semua sekolah terlibat. Pihak sekolah akan menilai semula sebelum sebarang tindakan lain dibuat," katanya ketika dihubungi pada Isnin.

Abdul Rashid berkata, semua pelajar terlibat dengan 20 sekolah berkenaan akan menjalani proses pengajaran dan pem-

belajaran di rumah (PdPR).

Difahamkan, antara sekolah yang ditutup ialah Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) St Mark dan SMK Kampung Kastam di Butterworth.

Di **NEGERI SEMBILAN** pula, Exco Pelaburan, Perindustrian, Keusahawanan, Pendidikan dan Modal Insan negeri, Dr Mohamad Rafie Ab Malek memaklumkan, sebanyak 11 sekolah diarahkan tutup di negeri itu.

"Sekolah terlibat akan ditutup sbagi membolehkan PKD membuat penilaian risiko, pengesanan kontak rapat dan proses disinfeksi," katanya.

Pada Jumaat lalu, Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) Seremban 2, ditutup tujuh hari sehingga 29 April selepas 17 pelajarinya disahkan positif Covid-19.

Tiga pelajar Sekolah Menengah Agama Persekutuan (SMAP) Labu, turut disahkan positif Covid-19.

**M**ajlis Pengarah Perustakaan Awam **S e m a l a y s i a** (MPAM) terus menjadi rakan sinergi yang aktif dalam meluaskan kempen World #QuranHour sejak tahun 2015 menerusi 1,000 cawangan di seluruh negara pada tahun ini.

Pengerusi MPAM, Ungku Noorakmal Ungku Sulaiman berkata, bermula dari Perbadanan Perpustakaan Awam Selangor (PPAS) pada tahun 2015, gerakan kempen tersebut disambut oleh semua perpustakaan di seluruh negara.

## MPK urged to retain old name of new square

RESIDENTS and elected representatives have commended Klang Municipal Council (MPK) for the transformation of the former Padang Chetty at Jalan Bukit Jawa.

However, they want the council to retain its moniker and not change it to Dataran Majlis Perbandaran Klang.

It is learnt that MPK would have the new name emblazoned on the archway at the entrance of the refurbished 1.34ha site.

MPK president Dr Ahmad Fadzli Ahmad Tajuddin confirmed that Padang Chetty would be renamed Dataran Majlis Perbandaran Klang.

The Selangor palace has given its approval to rename the field and it will be announced soon.

"MPK had proposed to the Selangor palace that it be named after a member of royalty but a few weeks ago, the palace said we could call it Taman Awam Majlis Perbandaran Klang or Dataran Majlis Perbandaran Klang," he said.

Padang Chetty comes under the Fundamuran constituency and its assemblyman Tony Leong Tuck Chee said the revitalisation of the field was to provide Klang residents with better amenities but not a name change.

"This would remove a big part of its identity, culture and heritage."

**Serjeet**, who used to train at Padang Chetty, has fond memories of the place.

"Padang Chetty's name should be retained as it reflects the contributions of the local south Indian community."

"It was the south Indians who used the field for gatherings and trade," he said.

Seniasta assemblyman G. Gunarat said while he welcomed the rejuvenation of Padang Chetty, its name should not be changed as it reflects Malaysia's rich cultural heritage.

"If Padang Chetty is renamed, it will affect our diversity," he said.

Sportsman and former international hockey umpire Serjeet Singh, 65, said he had fond memories of Padang Chetty where he used to train in the evenings for hockey tournaments.

"Padang Chetty produced the likes of the late Sukhvinderjeet Singh, S. Sivabalan, Abdul Rahim Ahmad, Zulkifli Zainal, Mohd Jalani Jamal, S. Prabaharan, M. Shammuganathan, K. Chandrasenan and many others who excelled in hockey and other sports."

"This should be reflected in its name," he added.

Former MPK Health Department director

**Zulkifli Abbas**, who retired from playing international hockey after the Los Angeles Olympics in 1984, said Padang Chetty was close to his heart.

"It was here that I was moulded to become the nation's top goalkeeper and I used to run up the slopes for physical conditioning."

"I understand the need to change with the times but I disagree with the new name," he said.

Zulkifli added that if the field was renamed, it would also affect the branding of Little India and tourism.

Masjid India Muslim Tengku Kelana chairman Md Yusoff Noor Mohamed said changing the name of Padang Chetty would be an affront to the local community.

"Our cultural identity would be erased and there will be no uniqueness," he added.

Former national hockey league manager Anthony Louis, 62, who worked in MPK, said the field got its name from the Chettiar merchants of Tamil Nadu who conducted their moneylending business across the field at Jalan Raya Barat.

"In addition, the 150-year-old Sri Nagara Thandayathapani Hindu temple and the Natukona Chettiar townhouse on one side of the field are managed by the Chettiar community."

"We must not erase the identity of the area and its people," he said.

Former national hockey league assistant manager P. Mohan, 62, who represented MPK in many sports events in the past, said there was a need to maintain the cultural attributes of ethnic enclaves be it Chinese, Indian, Javanese or Bugis so Malaysians could connect to our past.

"If the name is changed, it will affect our shared sense of place," he said.

# Tuju Setia seeing pre-Covid work volume in 2021

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Construction services group Tuju Setia Bhd is expecting business to recover to pre Covid-19 levels in 2021, based on its RM953.1mil order book as at end-March, according to managing director Wee Eng Kong.

"We will be busy in 2021. We are seeing figures similar to 2019, before the pandemic," said Wee after the launch of the group's initial public offering (IPO) prospectus here yesterday.

Also present was Alliance Investment Bank Bhd head of corporate finance Tee Kok Wah, who pointed out that from the latest order book, RM355mil is expected to be recognised for the last three quarters of 2021.

"This already exceeds the group's RM256mil revenue in 2020, and this does not even include the revenue for the first quarter of 2021," explained Tee.

Wee also said the group's latest order book would sustain its earnings till 2024, and it has a tender book of RM4bil.

According to the IPO prospectus, for the financial year ended Dec 31, 2020 (FY20), the group posted a 39.34% year-on-year (y-o-y) drop in revenue to RM255.77mil (FY19: RM421.64mil) due to a general slowdown of the construction industry coupled with the completion of a number of projects.

In FY20, the group posted a 4.61% y-o-y increase in profit after tax to RM16.27mil (FY19: RM15.55mil) due to a net gain on impairment of RM6mil, coupled with an improvement in the gross profit margin of the design and construction segment.

Regarding its dividend policy, Wee said the group aims to distribute 25% of its annual net

profit to reward shareholders.

"Tuju Setia's track record as a main contractor, and builder of choice is built on our core values of selecting a reputable clientele, having strong technical expertise and achieving quality accreditations.

"These strong fundamentals enabled Tuju Setia to persevere despite the challenging 2020.

"Not only did we achieve meaningful progress in our existing projects, but also won new mandates from trusted developers," he said.

Since its set-up in 2006, Tuju Setia has completed 18 high-rise projects of up to 51 levels with a contract value of RM2.23bil.

Wee added that the IPO will enhance Tuju Setia's current core competencies and improve the group's capacity in constructing high-rise buildings, and design and construction of hospitals and healthcare facilities.

Tuju Setia's order book comprises projects such as Mutiara Central Office Suites (Cheras), Riana Dutamas - Phase 2 (Segambut), The Pulse Residence (Bandar Puteri Puchong) and 121 Residences (Petaling Jaya), PPAM SofiyaResidensi (DesaParkCity), Emerald Hills - Phase 3 and 4 (Cheras), Tuai Residence (Setia Alam) and the Kajang Women and Children Hospital.

The group's clientele includes S P Setia Bhd, IJM Bhd, Bandar Raya Development Bhd, Perdana ParkCity Sdn Bhd, UEM Sunrise Bhd, Symphony Life Bhd, GuocoLand (Malaysia) Bhd and the Malaysian Public Works Department (JKR).

Tuju Setia aims to raise RM56mil from its IPO on the Main Market.

From the IPO proceeds, RM32mil will be for capital expenditure such as buying new construction machinery and equipment, and

building information modelling (BIM) system software to upskill design and construction activities, as well as buying land and constructing new storage facilities for better organisation and utilisation of machinery and equipment and improve efficiency of maintenance works.

Another RM19mil will be for working capital, and RM5mil to defray listing expenses.

Tuju Setia's IPO involves a public issuance of 80 million new shares priced at 70 sen apiece, along with an offer for sale of 27 million existing shares.

Of the 80 million new shares, 15.9 million shares will be for the Malaysian public via balloting, and 6.3 million shares will be for application by the group's eligible directors, employees and persons who have contributed to its success.

Another 31.7 million shares will be made available via private placement to selected bumiputra investors approved by the Ministry of International Trade and Industry.

The balance 26.1 million new shares, together with 27 million existing offer-for-sale shares, will be placed out to selected investors via private placement.

Applications for Tuju Setia's IPO will close on May 5, 2021 at 5pm.

Tuju Setia is slated to list on the Main Market on May 19, 2021.

Alliance Investment Bank Bhd is the principal adviser to Tuju Setia's IPO exercise, as well as joint underwriter and joint placement agent, together with CIMB Investment Bank Bhd.

## Better public transport options preferred over proposed highway in PJ

THEY may be on different sides of the political divide but that did not stop politicians from two parties from coming together to object to the proposed Petaling Jaya Dispersal (PJD) Link.

At a press conference, PKR's Petaling Jaya MP Maria Chin Abdullah and Selayang MP William Leong as well as Damansara MCA division chief Tan Gim Tuan stated their stand against the proposed highway.

The leaders said they supported 11 resident groups in Petaling Jaya who were opposed to the PJD Link.

Maria said the developers of the highway had yet to reveal the traffic impact assessment, environmental assessment and social impact assessment.

She wants residents' views to be presented at the Selangor Economic Action Council and hopes to arrange for a meeting with Selangor Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari.

Maria said the focus should be on

improving public transport system such as bus, LRT and MRT instead of building another highway, which she said would displace communities and residents.

"Those from areas such as Taman Medan badly need more bus routes and services.

"They want to be able to get to places in an affordable manner, which will help them land jobs and visit hospitals and markets," she said.

Meanwhile, Leong said although he was Selayang MP, he had been living in Petaling Jaya since 1973 and his house was on the proposed route for the highway.

He said the measurement of a city's growth should not be based on the number of highways it had but the community's well-being.

"As for compensation to owners of properties that would be

acquired for the project, no amount of money can compensate having to move elsewhere," he said.

Meanwhile, Tan, who grew up in Petaling Jaya, echoed residents' objections to the highway.

Tan said the Selangor government should uphold its election manifesto to gradually abolish tolled roads.

"The highway does not benefit Damansara and Petaling Jaya residents.

"Building more highways will not solve the traffic problem in this area.

"Only proper town planning will help resolve the traffic situation.

"This problem has been made worse over the past 10 years as the state and local government have been giving approvals without due consideration to the people and the environment," he said.

The coalition against PJD Link

Highway leader Sheikh Moqhtar Kadir said the group has gathered support from 11 residents groups.

# **Trade mission results in deals worth RM986mil**

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Malaysia's first trade and investment mission to South Korea and Japan amidst the pandemic and global challenges has generated export-related transactions worth RM986.15mil.

During the six-day mission which ended on April 6, a series of business discussions on sourcing of products and services were held, involving premium buyers and leading companies from both countries.

"About RM70mil of exports in products and services to South Korea were reported following the meetings with buyers from the country," said Malaysia External Trade Development Corp (Matrade) in a statement.

It added that one of the meetings involved South Korea's major retailer, GS Retail, the operator of more than 15,000 convenience stores and 289 supermarkets.

Members of the trade mission also held meetings with Japanese companies that trade in a wide range of products and materials such as Mitsubishi Corporation, Mitsui & Co and Daiso.

"Commitments were made to increase sourcing of fast-moving consumer goods, palm oil, halal products and services, as well as chemicals and chemical products from Malaysia," said Matrade.

It added that the meeting with Daiso aimed to provide Malaysian exporters with the opportunity to supply more products.

Matrade said the Japanese buyers expressed their commitment to purchase from Malaysia over the next 24 months, with an export value of RM916.15mil.

The delegation was led by Senior Minister and International Trade and Industry Minister, Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali. — Bernama

# Mission to South Korea, Japan secures RM8.9b investments

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Malaysia has secured committed investments of RM8.9 billion for 2021 from the April 1-6 investment mission to South Korea and Japan, which was led by Senior Minister cum International Trade and Industry Minister Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali.

Malaysian Investment Development Authority chief executive officer Arham Abdul Rahman said Malaysia continues to welcome high-quality foreign direct investment from around the world.

South Korea and Japan will continue to be major investor countries in the country, he said in a statement yesterday.

Topping the list of the secured investments was that from South Korea's SK Nexilis Co Ltd, a subsidiary of SK Group, which recently announced a RM2.3 billion investment to establish a thin copper foil manufacturing plant in Sabah.

However, the expected investment has been revised to RM4.24 billion.

Arham said: "The manufacturing plant in Kota Kinabalu will be powered utilising 100% renewable energy, where such operation will be the first for SK Nexilis outside South Korea."

SK Nexilis is a global leader in thin-tech innovation for copper foil manufacturing, controlling 16% share of the world market for electric vehicle batteries.

Another commitment is from LG Chem Ltd, which has indicated its interest in developing a petrochemical cluster in Malaysia. Arham said the company will set up a joint venture with Petronas Chemicals Group Bhd to produce nitrile-butadiene rubber latex in Pengerang Integrated Petroleum Complex with a potential investment of RM600 million, with operation expected to begin in March 2023.

SPC Group, a conglomerate producing food and confectionery products in South Korea, is planning to make Malaysia a regional distribution hub for its halal dough with an investment value of about RM91.2 million to cater to the Asean market.

From Japan, Nippon Electric Glass Co. Ltd, one of the world's leading manufacturers of specialty glass, will invest at least RM1 billion for the new production of e-glass fibre which will be used to produce automotive parts and components in the production of wind turbine blades for wind power generation. – Bernama

### Main Market-bound Tuju Setia aims to raise RM56m from IPO for growth plans

KUALA LUMPUR (April 26): Construction services company Tuju Setia Bhd, which is slated to be listed on the Main Market of Bursa Malaysia on May 19, is planning to raise RM56 million from its initial public offering (IPO) for its growth plans.

Its IPO involves a public issuance of 80 million new shares priced at 70 sen apiece, along with an offer for sale of 27 million existing shares. The first company to be listed on the Main Market in 2021, Tuju Setia will have a market capitalisation of RM222 million upon the listing.

Of the targeted amount, RM32 million will be allocated for the group's capital expenditure (capex) to purchase new construction machinery and equipment, and building

information modelling (BIM) system software to upskill design and construction activities. The group will buy land in the Klang Valley and build new storage facilities for better organisation and utilisation of machinery and equipment, and improve efficiency of its maintenance works. A further RM19 million will be used for working capital.

Speaking at a virtual briefing today, Tuju Setia managing director (MD) Wee Eng Kong said the IPO will enhance the group's core competencies and improve its capacity in constructing high-rise buildings, design and construction of hospitals and healthcare facilities.

As of March 2021, the group had secured four new contracts to build high-rise buildings, bringing its order book to RM953.1 million. With this, the group's earnings will be sustained until 2024, Wee said. Its tender

book stood at about RM4 billion.

"Undeniably, 2020 was not an easy-going year for the construction sector, no thanks to the Covid-19 pandemic and its aftermath. [But] with this combined order book and tender book, we have good fundamentals and a good start for this year.

"Notably, we will also be implementing a dividend policy to distribute 25% of our annual net profit to reward shareholders of Tuju Setia, and to show our appreciation of their confidence in our growth prospects," said Wee.

Applications for Tuju Setia's IPO will open today and close next Wednesday (May 5) at 5pm. Alliance Investment Bank Bhd is the principal adviser for Tuju Setia's IPO exercise, as well as a joint underwriter and joint placement agent, together with CIMB Investment Bank Bhd.

# Malaysia needs policy review on declining foreign interest

*The country must outline or target strategic industries in the high value-added tech and crucial industries that link the supply chains*

**MALAYSIA** needs a revised principle for its business operating environment to continue attracting external investments amid declining foreign interest, said economists.

Recently, the Cabinet approved the National Investment Aspirations (NIA), which is a framework that outlines Malaysia's reform policy for investment.

Senior Minister (Economy Cluster) cum International Trade and Industry Minister Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali previously mentioned that the reform will centre around revitalising Malaysia's investment climate, attracting high-quality interests and creating high-income jobs.

Universiti Kuala Lumpur Business School economic analyst Assoc Prof Dr Aimi Zulhazmi Abdul Rashid said a reset is required in several areas, including Malaysia's investment policy, targeted industries that are aligned with the global demand and the status of the country's political stability.

"From the foreign investors' point of view, especially the multinationals, the rapid changes in the international trade such as the US and China tariff war, Covid-19

pandemic and Brexit have certainly altered their investment strategy in the region, including Malaysia.

"Malaysia should have anticipated the plunge in FDIs (foreign direct investments) over the five-year trend at least, then it is a matter of other countries such as Vietnam to catch on and be on par with Malaysia.

"The reset may have negative outcomes in the short term. However, it can be mitigated with a healthier economic growth for the long term," he told *The Malaysian Reserve*.

The shift in large corporations' investment strategies has greatly affected Malaysia with many investors shifting to countries that are cheaper, more cost-effective and closer to their value chain, he explained.

He added that multinationals with large manufacturing operations that thrive on low-cost productivity will likely choose countries with cheaper labour costs such as Vietnam and Indonesia.

"All of the factors contribute equally to the reduction of foreign investments into Malaysia. Nonetheless, the volatility of the global economy has greatly influenced the current income.

"Not only the labour costs from the countries are cheaper, but the workers' skills have also improved in terms of communication and vocational skills in addition to the countries producing a large domestic market.

"Thus, competitors for such types of investments to Malaysia are no longer limited to Singapore and Thailand, as other countries in the region are relatively on par with Malaysia in most aspects," he said.

Aimi Zulhazmi said the newly launched reform policy is an important catalyst for Malaysia's business environment which has been long-anticipated and should be executed in line with the 12th Malaysia Plan.

"The policy reform is crucial as many multinationals are currently weighing their global strategies and actively looking at fresh incentives or initiatives offered to them, and thus Malaysia must capitalise on the current operating state.

"Malaysia must outline or target strategic industries that are not only in the high value-added technology but also crucial industries that link the supply chains.

"The strategic location of the country must be expanded and exploited to link all modes of transportation efficiently so that Malaysia becomes an integral part of the international network," he said.

According to a report by the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development, the FDI into Malaysia plummeted by more than two-thirds to just US\$2.5 billion (RM10.25 billion) in 2020.

The plunge was the worst compared to other countries in South-East Asia, with a large portion of the decline attributed to the Covid-19 pandemic.

However, the FDI into Malaysia has been recorded in a shaky pattern in the past 15 years and had bottomed at RM5.1 billion in 2009, an aftermath of the global financial crisis.

Meanwhile, Bank Islam Malaysia Bhd chief economist Dr Mohd Afzanizam Abdul Rashid said the NIA should address the current predicament and fit the current demand of foreign investors.

"Malaysia has always been a pro-business and investor-friendly country. This is reflected in the government policies via tax incentives, economic zoning and various government agencies that are responsible to hand-hold the incoming investors.

"The country has all that it takes to attract foreign investors. In that sense, the NIA should strengthen the value proposition that can be offered to the foreign investors who wish to participate in the country's long-term growth stories," he said.

Matrade added that more meetings between Matrade and GS Retail have been arranged to determine specific Malaysian suppliers that can meet the sourcing requirements of GS Retail.

In line with the development of the creative

industry, a meeting was also held with Moggozi Co Ltd, a Korean company that has co-produced with Malaysian partners and distributed Malaysia's animation production.

"Moggozi believes in Asian contents and creativity as a collaboration model, which is in sync with Malaysia's interest," Matrade said.

As for Japan, several meetings were con-

ducted to secure commitments on increasing the source for FMCG products, palm oil, halal products and services, as well as chemicals and chemical products from Malaysia.

"In addition to the meetings with Japan's major trading companies, business exchanges were also held with Daiso Industries Co Ltd, a popular operator of ¥100 (RM3.79) shop, which carries a wide range of household items," Matrade said.

"In 26 countries, Daiso operates 5,741 stores, of which more than half are in Japan. The meeting with Daiso also has been arranged by Matrade to connect Malaysian exporters to an opportunity of supplying more Malaysian products," the agency said.

Currently, about 160 stock-keeping units of Malaysian products are available in Daiso outlets in Japan.

Matrade said the Japanese buyers have shown encouraging interest in purchasing products from Malaysia over the next 24 months, amounting to RM916.15 million of export value.

During the mission, Matrade also signed a memorandum of cooperation with the Japan External Trade Organisation to strategically strengthen Malaysia's trade promotion cooperation with Japan in areas such as halal, information and communications technology, e-commerce and digital transformation.

莲花苑州议员黎淮褓披露，他周日早上接获选民求助电话，发现是家庭成员集体确诊的情况，其中一家五口，除了父亲没确诊，妻子和3名孩子全都确诊，目前居家隔离。

“另一宗则是一家七口中有6人全确诊冠病，其中4人已被送往隔离中心，1人已近痊愈，1人居家隔离，居家隔离的患者虽已出现呼吸困难、发烧和身体虚弱的症状，但至今无救护车前来将他接走。”

他强调，因情况严重，他周日把

报告带至附近的新冠肺炎评估中心(CAC)，向站岗的医生反映确诊者的情况，相信对方已于下午5时30分将患者载走。

他披露，蕉赖六哩村的马来村长一家三口也全部确诊，因村长夫人在外感染病毒后也传给村长和其残障孩子，而其孩子入院隔离数日后就离世。

“近期接到许多求助电话，大部分都是家庭成员集体确诊的案例，虽然我没有完整数据和资料，但住家的集体感染不断飙升和日益严重。”

他指出，去年管制令期间的确诊病例达300多宗，人人都喊怕，但近期的确诊病例已逐渐飙升，社区中很多人没有保持人身距离，犹如病毒已不存在。
