### Conteng mural: Polis sudah peroleh beberapa petunjuk

**Petaling Jaya:** Beberapa perkara teknikal sedang diselaraskan sebelum siasatan terhadap kes menconteng perkataan kurang menyenangkan pada mural gergasi potret beberapa pemimpin negara di Taman Cahaya Alam, Seksyen U12, Shah Alam, dekat sini, diselesai-

kan dalam masa terdekat.

Timbalan Ketua Polis Negara Datuk Mazlan Mansor (*gambar*) berkata, beberapa petunjuk sudah diperolehi polis dan siasatan lanjut berkaitan teknikal kini dilaksanakan.

"Kami berharap isu ini diselesaikan secepat mungkin

dan ia mungkin mengambil sedikit masa berikutan polis perlu memperhalusi perkara itu dengan betul dan menahan mereka yang terbabit insiden ini," katanya pada sidang media di Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Petaling Jaya di sini, semalam.

Terdahulu, satu rakaman

kamera litar tertutup (CC-TV) tular di media sosial 20 Julai lalu memaparkan dua kelibat wanita dipercayai datang merosakkan mural berkenaan.

Rakaman video berdurasi dua minit 20 saat itu menunjukkan sebuah kereta di parkir berhampiran lukisan

mural berkenaan sebelum kelibat dua individu itu muncul melakukan vandalisme.

Susulan contengan dilakukan terhadap mural pemimpin negara itu, Majlis Bandaraya Shah Alam (MB-SA) bertindak memadam semua mural berkenaan.

### Gangguan bekalan air 25 jam di Gombak bermula 11 Ogos

**KUALA LUMPUR** - Sebanyak 20 kawasan di Wilayah Gombak bakal berdepan gangguan bekalan air berjadual untuk tempoh 25 jam bermula 11 sehingga 12 Ogos ini susulan henti tugas sementara di Loji Rawatan Air (LRA) Sungai Gombak.

Pengurusan Air Selangor Sdn Bhd (Air Selangor) menerusi satu kenyataan media semalam memaklumkan, henti tugas berkenaan dilakukan bagi memberi laluan kepada kerja-kerja penambahbaikan dan penggantian aset kritikal di LRA berkenaan.

Air Selangor berkata, pelaksanaan kerja-kerja penambahbaikan dan penggantian aset kritikal ini perlu dilaksanakan bagi membolehkan loji berkenaan beroperasi dengan lebih cekap di samping memastikan semua peralatan sentiasa berada dalam keadaan baik.

“Kerja-kerja ini akan bermula pada 11 Ogos jam 8.30 dan dijangka sebanyak 20 kawasan di Wilayah Gombak bakal mengalami gangguan bekalan air berjadual ini,” katanya.

Menerusi senarai berkenaan, antara kawasan yang dijangka

terlibat ialah Batu 8 Jalan Gombak, Batu 9 Jalan Gombak, Batu 10 Jalan Gombak, Taman Permai Jaya Gombak, Kampung Sungai Salak, British Malaysia Institute, Sekolah Al Amin, International Islamic School dan Kolej Vokasional Gombak.

Selain itu, kawasan lain yang turut terjejas ialah Taman Mutiara, Sekolah Integrasi Gombak, Kampung Sungai Cincin, Kampung Tengah Gombak, Kampung Sungai Pusu, Villa Bistari, Desa Gemilang, Universiti Islam Antarabangsa Malaysia (UIAM), Apartment UIAM, Jabatan Hal Ehwal Orang Asli (JHEOA) dan Hospital JHEOA.

# Illegal dumping leads to contamination of pond

MBSA says landowner told to clean up site and erect hoarding

THE rubbish pile that is visible from the Federal Highway near Batu Tiga is said to be linked to a construction site in Shah Alam. A check by *StarMetro* recently found mounds of domestic and construction wastes at the site, causing an acrid stench to permeate the area.

Some waste from the site had spilled into an adjacent pond next to the highway's motorcycle lane, causing the water to turn brownish.

Shah Alam City Council (MBSA) Corporate Communications deputy head Azlan Dollah said two lorries were caught dumping waste illegally there during an operation on March 12.

"The offender was fined RM1,000 for each of the lorries that were seized under the Rubbish Collection and Disposal by-laws (MBSA) 2007," he said.

He disclosed that the Selangor Housing and Property Board (LPHS), which owns the land, had been instructed to erect temporary hoarding around the site.

"A written notice has been issued to LPHS to clean up and transport the waste to the Jeram Sanitary Landfill in Kapar for disposal."

Azlan added that the 1.62ha site is earmarked for the devel-

opment of two blocks of Rumah Selangorku comprising 620 apartment units.

LPHS development planning engineer Mohamed Aliif Mohamed Roznan said the board had lodged a police report on the matter.

"We will rebuild the hoarding that came down during heavy rain a few weeks ago, and will start the clean-up soon," he said.

He added that the site had obtained a planning approval on July 9.

MBSA Environmental Health senior assistant officer Abdullah Md Yusof said the domestic refuse must be cleared and the construction waste needed to be sent to the landfill.

Pertubuhan Pelindung Khazanah Alam Malaysia (Peka) national chairman Puan Sri Shariffa Sabrina Syed Akil said the construction waste if left at the site might affect the soil structure, which would endanger the people who would be living in the apart-

ments in the future.

Meanwhile, Peka Selangor chairman Damien Thanam Divean urged the authorities to ensure the pond's water quality be restored immediately.

"The pond is a popular spot among local anglers while also being home to many aquatic species, but has now turned brownish due to oxidation," he pointed out.

He expressed worry that effluent from the site might affect underground water.

Also present during the site visit was Peka administrative officer Norhayati Shahrom.

Meanwhile water quality expert Dr Zaki Zainudin said domestic waste dumped into the pond would

cause the level of dissolved oxygen (DO) in the water to deplete.

"If food waste and other perishable items are found in the rubbish, there is potential for organic substances, ammonia, nitrate and phosphorus to leak into the pond, especially during a downpour.

"The substances that leached into the pond will subsequently decay, thus lowering the level of DO," said Dr Zaki.

He explained that the presence of nitrate and phosphorus would also intensify algae growth in the pond.

"Although algae produce oxygen during the day, they take up more oxygen after dark, which will further reduce the water's DO level.

"If the DO level gets too low, it will kill the fish," he said.

He added that the presence of other inorganic materials such as trace metals and solvents would harm the aquatic ecosystem."

Dr Zaki said the sediments at the bottom of the pond must be inspected for waste residue.

"If there is residue, this needs to be excavated and sent to a sanitary landfill and the pond must be treated as well.

"Signage should be erected with the authority's contacts to deter illegal dumpers and encourage participation of the local community in protecting the area against pollution," he added.

TUBERCULOSIS (TB) patients who are currently undergoing treatment in Selangor are urged to apply for cash incentives offered by the Selangor government.

Each qualified patient will be given RM800 which will be issued in three stages.

"To encourage patients to complete their treatment, we will give the first RM200 after they complete two months of treatment, followed by RM200 after the next two months and RM400 after the whole course is completed, which is six months in total," said state health, welfare, women empowerment and family committee chairman Dr Siti Mariah Mahmud.

She added that the government had allocated RM2mil to be given out this year but to-date, only 78 patients had applied for the incentive. Out of the 78, only 60 have been approved.

"One of our difficulties is reaching out to patients due to doctor-patient confidentiality. We do not have access to those who are undergoing treatment as that information is private and confidential," she said.

She elaborated that the state health department could not provide them with the information.

# TB patients in Selangor can apply for cash aid

### Current and recovered Covid-19 patients can also seek help online

Dr Siti Mariah hopes more people will be aware of this incentive and apply for it as a means to help patients cope with the six-month TB treatment.

To meet the criteria, patients must be Malaysians residing in Selangor and are currently getting treatment in the state.

"Patients can rest assure that all their information will be kept confidential by us and we will transfer the money directly into their bank accounts.

"Applications can be done online via [www.selangorprihatin.com](http://www.selangorprihatin.com), with all the necessary documents as proof," she said.

Additionally, the state has approved RM1.8mil for past and current Covid-19 patients.

Covid-19 patients as well as

those who have recovered from the disease are urged to apply for the cash incentive online.

"We are giving out RM1,000 per patient or to the family of the deceased.

"We will need those who are qualified for the incentive to also come forward as we do not have access to patient information," she said.

Similar to the TB incentive, those applying for this aid must be Malaysians residing in Selangor for at least five years, with proof from government hospital or clinic that they are being or had been tested positive for Covid-19.

"Even if you are a former patient, you are still entitled to receive this incentive from the

state. Just show us the necessary documents as proof and we will process the application online," said Dr Siti Mariah.

To-date, only 349 applicants

have applied with 195 approved so far.

She added that the incentive started in April but not many knew about it yet.
